Participants will learn about a "customized" approach to self employment; where the degree, type and intensity of supports needed varies from one person to the next. Those who complete the course requirements within the specified timeframe may earn **1.6 CEUs or 16 CRCs and/or a Certificate of Course Completion** from VCU.

## Customized Employment

February 15 - March 15, 2010

**Cost:** \$80 per person

**Description:** Customized employment is a process for individualizing the employment relationship between a job seeker and an employer in ways that meet the needs of both. It is based on a match between the unique strengths, needs, and interests of the job candidate with a disability, and an employer's needs. It may also include self-employment options. This four week course takes a look at how to customize employment. Participants will learn about ways to use a flexible blend of strategies, services, supports, and funds to negotiate employment for individuals with disabilities. Those who complete the course requirements within the specified time frame may earn 1.6 CEUs or 16 CRCs and/or a Certificate of Course Completion from VCU.

## Supported Employment Web-based Certificate Series **March 1 - May 24, 2010**

This course is ACRE certified. Individuals completing all course requirements will earn a National Certificate in Employment Services. In addition participants who complete the course requirements within the specified time frame may earn 3.5 CEUs or 35 CRCs and/or a Certificate of Course Completion from VCU.

**Cost:** \$250 per person or group discount rate of \$1,000 for 5 people

**Description:** The supported employment has long been established as an effective way to assist an individual with a more significant disability with gaining and maintaining work in the community. In this forward thinking and practical approach to employment support, individuals with significant support needs are not perceived as "unemployable" nor do they have to spend time to "get ready" for work. In this twelve week course (one new lesson every two weeks) professionals will learn more about the individual approach to supported employment.

### Topics covered include:

- Using functional strategies to learn how the job seeker can make a meaningful contribution to the workplace,
- Meeting with business to better understand employment needs and develop jobs,
- Implementing workplace supports to include instructional strategies, assistive technology and natural supports,
- Providing long term job retention services, and
- Identifying creative funding options.

## Supported Competitive Employment for Individuals with Mental Illness **March 1 - May 24, 2010**

This course is ACRE certified. Individuals completing all course requirements will earn a National Certificate in Employment Services. In addition participants who complete the course requirements within the specified time frame may earn 3.5 CEUs or 35 CRCs and/or a Certificate of Course Completion from VCU.

**Cost:** \$250 per person or group discount rate of \$1,000 for 5 people

**Description:** This course will examine how to apply the Individual Placement and Support Model (a supported employment approach) to assist individuals with have a mental illness with going to work in the community. This twelve week course (one new lesson every two weeks) will cover the evidence-based practices that have been used to pave the way to support individuals with mental illness in employment examined. Topics include understanding Evidence Based Practice Research, building relationships with business, working with an individual to establish a career direction, developing jobs, identifying a need for and implementing work supports, and understanding work incentives.

**ACRE Certification:** The Association of Community Rehabilitation Educators (ACRE) awards nationally recognized Certificates of Achievement to providers of employment services to people with disabilities. This Certificate documents that the provider has satisfactorily completed a minimum of 40 hours of training or professional development provided by an ACRE-approved training resource. Virginia Commonwealth University is a member of ACRE, and the Supported Employment Online Certificate Series and the Supported Competitive Employment for Individuals with Mental Illness online courses are both recognized training programs. Individuals who complete all of the requirements for VCU's online courses in supported employment will be eligible to receive a National Certificate in Employment Services. ## Into Adulthood: Transition to Work for Individuals with Autism **March 1 - April 4, 2010**

**Cost:** \$275 (you must purchase a textbook which costs \$23.07)

**Description:** More now than ever, individuals with autism spectrum disorders are participating in the mainstream of school, work, and the community. Careful transition planning from secondary education is critical for young people with autism spectrum disorders to be successful; however, there is limited information on this topic. In this six week course an in-depth look at the concepts related to positive transition planning for youth with autism will take place. The issues, challenges, and strategies that are involved with helping young people with autism participate to the fullest degree in society will be examined. Those who complete the course requirements within the specified time frame may earn **4.5 CEUs or 45 CRCs and/or a Certificate of Course Completion** from VCU.

Special Note for Teachers in Virginia Teachers who would like to use this course as a professional development activity for re-certification will need prior approval of their school district. The school district will be responsible for designating the actual number of points that a teacher can earn for participating in the course.
